Dividing the spoils for 1994...

The club awards for 1994 have been spread among several runners, compared with previous years when one or two members have dominated the scene. Only one runner achieved the best time over more than one distance - Andy Robertson's 35:36 for 10 kilometres (Bromham) and 57:44 for 10 miles (Bournemouth). Roger Carey's 1:20:56 in the Bath half-marathon and Ted Rockliffe's 3:10:36 in the London marathon secured their awards and Dennis Mellor's 3:34:18 in the New Forest event earned him the Vic Bull Trophy for the best marathon by a member over 50.

Rosemary Barber clocked 40:01 in the Totton 10-kilometre race to earn the award for that distance, Jackie Rockliffe's 1:07:13 for 10 miles at Bournemouth was a personal best by four and a half minutes, the Bath half-marathon was the scene of Linda Brown's award-winning 1:28:08, and Christina Tyler secured the marathon prize with her 3:58:20 in London.

A French recipe: running plus romance THE ARGENTAN HALF-MARATHON - 1 OCTOBER 1994 by Nigel Stevens

The race really didn't take any planning. A phone call to the hotel in Argentan to reserve a room for the Friday and Saturday nights, booking the Portsmouth-Caen ferry, and arranging for baby-sitters, to enable Sue and me to have a weekend break in France, including the Argentan half-marathon.

The organization of the race and the whole weekend was brilliant. Jean-Paul Kerneau (a French English teacher) arranged everything, from hotel reservations or lodging with local runners to race numbers and dinner-dance tickets. There was even a free return bus service for the 40km ride from Caen to Argentan for those English runners without cars. The other goodies included a free pasta party on the Friday night, free T-shirt and a special reception for foreign runners the night before the race. All this for an entry free of 50 francs (about £6).

The weekend proper started with a reception in the town hall: a welcoming speech by the mayor, a quick introduction to clubs or foreign contingents, and as much free booze as we could drink (possibly to ensure that fast foreigners drank as much as possible and didn't run off with all the prizes the next day!). The previous year Colin Williamson and I just had to try all the various liqueurs made in Normandy . . . and after about an hour we'd planned to knock several minutes off our pb's - a plan which didn't work. This time it was different. Sue had tied my hands behind my back, and Colin was stuck in Trowbridge, so we resisted all alcohol, drinking only Perrier water. After the reception, it was off to the pasta party: pasta salad, spag. bol., macaroni, camembert cheese and finally gateau de semoule (semolina pudding) - in 1993 we drank too much, in 1994 we ate too much!

Race day (Saturday) dawned in near-perfect conditions: cloudy, cool and windless; we were in for a good run! After a short stroll around the town we made our way to race headquarters for the 1.30 start. Of the 1,200 runners about 900 were doing the half and the remainder the full two-lap marathon. By the time the gun went off the sun had come out and the temperature had risen to 20°C, promising a hot race. The course was flat, starting in the town centre, looping out in countryside lanes through tiny villages before returning to Argentan for the finish. There were plenty of drinks stations (even an English one at about eight miles, complete with Union Jack), and most of the villagers seemed to come out to watch and give encouragement.

I started well, under my target pace of 4min/km, but after about 10 miles (c. 64 minutes) I slowed a little and finished in 1:24:30 - not bad considering the heat and the fact that I was overtaken by a French butcher in the last 400 yards! Conditions must have been pretty good, though, as both marathon and half-marathon course records were broken: the half was won in c. 1:04, and in the marathon a Frenchman easily beat Derek Green, previous record-holder, into second place in 2:21. When we had finished and arrived back in the sports hall for our free drinks, they were already showing a video of the race on large tv screens.

I'd like to tell you about the fabulous dinner-dance they held in the sports hall on the evening after the race, but I can't since Sue and I had a quiet romantic dinner in the Hotel de France restaurant, complete with all the wine and drink which I'd missed out on the night before. However, we'll be back, and if you're thinking of a race somewhere special for a change, perhaps we could arrange an AVR minibus...?
