The club's tenth annual general meeting was held in the Avon Sports Club, Bradford-on-Avon, on Thursday 4 January. It was an occasion to look back on a decade of achievement in realizing the original aim of Avon Valley Runners' formation — to provide the right blend of companionship and competition to suit all needs.

Officers for the year ahead resulted in few changes from 1995: President Mike Holland, vice-president Clive Crocker, chairman Colin Williamson, vice-chairman Bob Ellis, secretary Stan Farr, assistant secretary Judy Farr, treasurer Dennis Mellor, men's captain Bob Ellis, vice-captain Andy Robertson, women's captain Joyce Field, vice-captain Judy Farr, coach Bob Ellis, press officer Colin Williamson, additional committee members Mike Brain, Gerry Fice, Mike Hehir, Bernie Hobbs, Maureen Laney, Simon Reeves, Ted Rockliffe.

A discussion was held on the possibility of moving from Culver Close to the Avon Sports Club for Thursday evening training. As there had been an exchange of letters with the district council on the condition of facilities at Culver Close, it was decided to allow two months for the council to bring about the improvement requested. Accordingly, there will be an extraordinary general meeting on Thursday 7 March at a venue to be announced, at which the matter will be decided by ballot.

The club men's and women's championships for 1996 will be held in conjunction with the Trowbridge 5.9-mile road race on Sunday 24 March. This year there will also be awards in the over-40, over-45 and over-50 veteran categories.
