## Giddy Up

Two teams of Avon Valley Runners got under starters orders for the 27<sup>th</sup> running of the **Badminton Horseless Team Event**. The race over five miles takes runners around the 1,500 acre estate of the Duke of Beaufort and presents the runners with the challenge of some of the obstacles faced during the famous Badminton Horse Trails. Choosing suitably equestrian names, The AVR Stallions consisted of Captain Carl "Crazy Horse" Davies, Michael "Trigger" Towler, Chris "Bullseye" Atkinson, Richard "Ho-Ho Silver" Morgetroyd and

With the going good to firm Trigger immediatley shot off in hot pursuit of last years winner from Stroud AC with Crazy Horse a few lengths behind. After about quarter of a mile the first obstacle was reached, a raised bar at about knee height which was easily leapt whilst keeping stride.



Then nothing apart from the glorious scenary of the Badminton estate bathed in a light misty rain for the next two and a half miles. Then the obstacles came thick and fast, a six foot log-pile (how the diminutive Tina got over this we may never know); A short flight of steps with each step being about three feet high



(the organisers had thoughtfully provided some hay bales to give us a leg up); More hurdles, More log piles and the Water jump. Trigger managed to take the lead after three miles and pulled away to cross the finish line in twenty seven minutes and forty four seconds to win. Crazy Horse crossed the line a few minutes later to take third and Hi-Ho Silver sixth. However being a Team Event it was down to the fourth scorer on which the final positions would be decided upon and just managing to keep ahead of Cheltenham's Almost Athletes, Bullseye finished in 13<sup>th</sup> position to ensure that the winners trophy returned with us back to West Wiltshire.
