Flying the County flag

Avon Valley Runners were well represented at the **South West Inter-county XC Championships** at Bicton College in Devon with members of our club making up over half of the county's Senior teams on the day.

Making his debut representing Wiltshire was Tom Fisher who was our first man back over the 8K course recording 28:10 and finishing in 12th place overall with Mike Towler finishing 20th. Other AVR debutee's wearing the green vests of Wiltshire were Dave Spencer who finished 29th and Carl Davies finishing 51st.

In the Ladies race over 5.5K also representing the county, Karen Butler was the second Wiltshire lady back finishing in 30th place overall recording 25:48 and gaining revenge over Team Bath's Zina Marchant (who had beaten her to the runners-up spot in the **Wiltshire XC Championships** in December) Mel Nicholls finished in 34th and in 42nd place Rosemary Barber finished the race as 3rd FV60.

Secretaries Report

At the AGM, I reported on a great year for Avon Valley Runners in 2010:

We attracted 53 new members into the club mainly through the Beginners sessions held at Trowbridge. Of the 215 members of AVR at the end of 2009, 168 rejoined marking a 78% retention rate and of the 81 new members that we gained in 2009, 61 renewed their membership (75%) leaving us at the end the year with an all time high membership level of 220!!!

The club now has six UK:Athletics accredited coaches, four at Level-2 and two at Level-1. In addition the club now has eight accredited Running Group Leaders. The Race Series proved popular and brought a number of team prizes back to the club, notably at the **Pewsey Terminator** where we won the "Big team challenge" and the Wiltshire XC Championships where AVR were crowned both Mens and Ladies county champions. Team prizes in Race Series events were also received at the Devizes 10K, Melksham 5K, Foxtrot 5, Warminster Forest 10 and the Bromham Pudding Run. AVR entered three teams into the Cotswold Way Relay; two teams into the Uphill to Wells Relay where our ladies retained their title and the Men finished third; two teams into the Badminton Horseless Trials where our Men won the five mile title. The Club Championships were dominated by Tom Fisher and Jo Mumford with 19 men and 8 ladies completing the requisite 10K, 10M & Half Marathon. The Chippenham Half proved to be the most popular event among AVR members with 40 taking part. Club records were set in 2010 with Tom Fisher breaking the long standing records for 5M at the Foxtrot 5, 10K at the Devizes 10K and had a near miss at the Chippenham Half Marathon as did Michel Towler at the Melksham 5K and Ruth Barnes at the Bristol Half Marathon. We also hosted a number of fun events including the Melksham Hash, The Mini-Mash, Treasure Run, Track Championships and Mob-Match against Chippenham Harriers & Corsham Running Club.

Our Open events were very well received among the local running community with "Over the Hills" organised by Simon Ringham attracting over 300 runners and producing a home victory through Tom Fisher. The Conkwell Killer organised by Julia Drewitt unfortunately drew only around 50 runners and will probably not be run again. Our new event: The Avon Valley Relay attracted 10 teams and some excellent feedback. The Avon Valley Mile saw Carl Davies and Sarah Jewers take the honours. Sarah Jewers also debutted as Race Director as she organised the Sport Relief event at Melksham. Alan Hayes overcame the snow and ice to make sure that the Stan Farr 5K went ahead for the second year at Hilperton.

Additionally lifetime membership was also awarded to Tony Griffith for service to Avon Valley Runners.



Jo has not been alone in providing good humour following moments of muppetry: Who can forget Debbie Roberts getting lost on the inaugural **Avon Valley Mile** (*It is an out & back course*) or Sarah Jewers following a runner for several miles at the **Uphill to Wells Relay** before realising that they were nothing to do with the race, when they got into a car and drove off! So the bar has been set pretty high for this award and it was with a wry smile that the "Goofy" was awarded to Michael Towler along with his many trophies for more athletic achievements, to mark the moment at the **Tadley 10** (*where he finished third overall*) was awarded a glass trophy which he then manged to drop and smash at the presentation!

What is in a name?

In these days of increased reliance on computers by race organisers, whether entering a race online or by using a traditional entry form it has become more important than ever to ensure that you enter your club or team name fully and correctly.
