The 2025 edition of the AVR Wiltshire Half Marathon takes place on Sunday 23rd November.

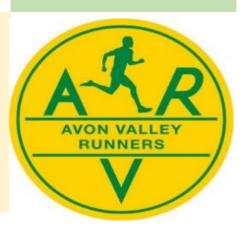

Courir dans la chaleur

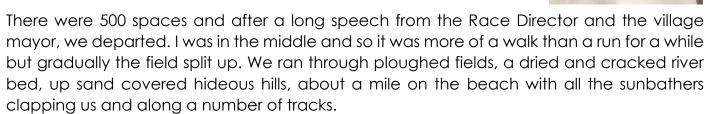
Running in France seems idyllic, some may even say romantic; those beautiful countryside views with rolling hills, sunflowers, vineyards and the smells of freshly baked bread and sea food. Add to that the chance to compete for AVR in another country and enjoy some summer sun and the sign up almost happened automatically.

I've been holidaying in the Vendée with my wife and after a disappointing race year (mainly due to repeated minor injuries) I decided that a gentle race in some warmer weather would be just the tonic so began the search for a local run. Parkrun has yet to make it to this part of France so that was out of the question and there didn't seem to be an abundance of 5k road races either. I stumbled on a very reasonably priced 15km trail run at €14 and it was only couple of miles from where we were staying. The race distance was a bit further than I'd have liked but that was all that was available.

Two days before the race I was emailed offering me the chance to get a refund as the race was subject to 'des fortes chaleurs annoncées' and that I had to be self-sufficient for water. To give some context, it has been 36°C until about 7pm at night here so I did consider it but thought I'd give it a go anyway.

Originally my plan had been to run at 10-minute miles as that was a nice pace to cope with the heat but had not anticipated just how aggressive the route was going to be. The French organisers were lovely in not providing a GPX file or even a chance to look at the route so I had no idea what I was letting myself into!

I turned up at 5pm to pick up my bib number and collect my timing chip. At the same time was offered the choice of a packet of pasta or a beer. As the writing on my bib shows, I chose wisely.



There were two water breaks which in reality were more about someone pointing a hosepipe at you and soaking you to cool down rather than drinking water but all part of the experience.

People often talk about different types of fun...this was definitely type 2! I finished it eventually, came 252nd out of 400 runners in a time of 1:40 but the time was unimportant for me...I was glad to finish it!

The race was won by Noe ROUTHIAU in a time of 1:00-a little research and it turns out he's a pretty good runner!

A great experience and proud to wear the vest. If you get a chance to run in France, choose a cooler day!

So, I am going to look back at what we as a club achieved in this month 5, 10, 20 and 35-years ago...

September 2020

In this month five years ago:

A small group of Avon Valley Runners headed to **Hullavington** for a COVID compliant 5K. In 29th place, Toby Firkins clocked 18:35 and in 51st position was Andy Wareham, who clocked 22:39. Our Ladies were led home by 61st placed Sara Robert with 26:51 who was very closely followed by 62nd placed Sharon Firkins in 26:54.

September 2015

In this month ten years ago:

George Gurney set a new club record time of 1:11:12 at the Bristol Half Marathon.

The club trip to Germany for the **Leer Running Festival** saw some good results, with Fiona Price setting a new course record for the Half Marathon, which she won in a time of 1:27:40. In 4th place was Suzann Large in 1:50:26; 17th Michele Platten - 2:41:26; 18th Laura Oatley - 2:41:26. Whilst for the Men, 4th was Thomas Coney in 1:23:58, followed by 6th Peter Veleski - 1:26:16; 42nd Ian Isaacs - 1:49:36 and 65th Sean Price - 2:10:01 – whilst dressed as a lemon!!!

In the 10K, Rich Ayling just missed out on the podium with a fourth place finish in 36:32, ahead of 22nd Warren Wade - 44:27 & 125th Jim Chalmers - 72:33. For the Ladies we had 93rd Sharon Cleverly - 52:52; 169th Sara Robert - 65:19; 170th Allison Perkins - 65:39; 175th Helen Veleska - 68:07; 176th Hayley Bell - 68:07 and 178th Vicky Ody - 73:01. Darren Wrintmore was our lone representative in the 5K and clocked 20:37 for 17th place.

Segment of the Month - Our penultimate round of segments brought us two climbs:

<u>Sign to the Top</u> was a quad burning 10% climb up from Bratton to the top of Westbury White Horse. Just ten members tackled this ascent with Tom Carpenter (5:25) and Jenny Nattrass (6:18) being the leading "mountain goats".

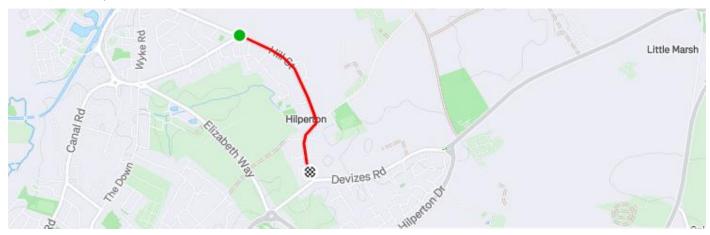
Our second climb in August was the <u>Keevil Rise</u> which proved a popular 2-mile segment starting just outside of Bulkington and finishing near to Great Hinton. Nineteen members tackled this ascent with Tom Carpenter (5:43) and Caroline Scott (6:09) being quickest speedsters over this lengthy incline.

So on to our final round in the monthly element of our Stava Segment Challenge competition...

For September we see the return of the <u>Worm Hill</u> climb at Bradford Leigh which despite its diminutive sounding name is quite a leg sapping climb albeit at just 0.38-miles in length and at a 3.4% gradient. So far this year 29 club members have tackled this with Darren Wrintmore 1:12 and Annalie Ibison 1:19 being the fastest so far.



Our second segment, last featured in 2020 and is the 0.7-mile climb up <u>Hill Street</u> in Trowbridge. Thirty-six club members have ridden this route so far in 2025, with Alan Best in 1:56 and Emily Dye in 2:01 are the quickest so far.
